News from Duchy Defibrillators

Regarding the unit at No Man's Land.

Dear Community,

We're excited to share some important news that highlights our commitment to improving life-saving resources in our area. Here at Duchy Defibrillators, we are pleased to announce that we have teamed up with Bleed Control UK and Front Line Emergency Equipment Trust (FLEET) to enhance support for our communities.

FLEET has recently acquired 270 public access bleed control kits from Bleed Control UK. These kits will be installed in the 270 public access defibrillator cabinets that we manage, ensuring our communities are well-prepared for emergencies.

All 270 public access cabinets that are maintained by us will receive a public access bleed control kit for free! We will be installing these kits in the cabinets and updating the signage to indicate their presence over the coming weeks and months.

The team at Duchy Defibrillators will handle the installation and add new vinyls to the cabinets as part of our collaboration with FLEET and Bleed Control UK. The kits in the cabinets we maintain will be checked by our service engineers every 5-6 weeks when doing defibrillator checks.

"Well! When I was a girl, we never had any problem with teenagers!"

The older generation can rightfully despair at gang-fighting, neurodiverse, knife-carrying, degenerate snowflakes of the popular press. The sight of an e-bike or iphone can trigger an out-pouring of righteous indignation - the youth of today!



Back in the days of the Manors, Bucklawren, Treveria, Keverall Trelowia and Pendrym would all be responsible for their own offspring. Any trouble, the whole community was punished. It was in everybody's interest to make sure that youngsters became good citizens, aware of the laws and customs. At 16 a lad would be called to court to pledge his loyalty to his fellow men, View of Frankpledge.

Children in trouble were taken on by relatives or neighbours. Francis Drake was taken on by Cousin Hawkins when his mother had 10 more boys! The Church had a sobering influence with a seasonal rhythm and offered basic education. The first schools in Looe taught maths, navigation and astronomy! Summer and Autumn Visitors

Over the last few months we have had some interesting sightings and activities in the garden. One event happened on a very hot day in July when I noticed, what appeared to be at first glance, a mouse on the patio. Upon closer inspection it turned out to be a Pipistrelle bat – given that the temperature was in the 20's in mid-afternoon this was not normal. There were no signs of injury to the little creature but it did look immature and the fact that we have bats in our loft space it was a logical conclusion – but still out of the ordinary. With as little handling as possible. I placed it in a small box and put it in a cool and dark place waiting for sunset. My intention was to release it after dark. When the time came there were bats flying overhead so I felt confident that this was the solution - I left the little chap in the folds of our patio parasol. Imagine my disappointment on seeing it there the next morning - this was when we decided to contact the Bat Conservation Trust in Plymouth who arranged for it to be picked up by one of their volunteers - phew, what a relief – responsibility relinquished.

One other similar event happened weeks earlier – again on a hot sunny day. I found a hedgehog in the open on the lawn. It seemed to be unharmed and no visible signs of injury – hedgehogs would not nor-

mally be found in the open in daylight.

By the size and weight of the animal I deduced it was an adult as it weighed over 800 grams.

We do have a hedgehog house in the garden and so I replaced the bedding, supplied food and water and left the hog to settle in. On checking the next morning the hog had left – since then we have occasionally had visitors in the hedgehog house during the day – much to the delight of the grandchildren.



Summer and Autumn Visitors

Another visitor in early October was a bit of a surprise – standing motionless in rough grass was a Grey Heron. We do have a pond in the garden, and Herons have visited in the past, but this bird was quite some distance from it – the part of the garden where it was seen does have frogs, toads and slow worms but no observations were made as to what, if anything, it was stalking. Unusual to see this bird out of its normal environment – it lingered for some time and then left as quietly as it had arrived.

My daughter and son-in-law have a dairy farm not far from us and I often get reports of sightings from the farm – animals often seen are Foxes, Badgers and Deer. One bird that has visited occasionally, using the barns as a roost, is a Barn Owl. I did manage to get some pictures of the bird myself after getting a tip off from my grandson.

Another more unusual visitor to the barn was a Sparrow Hawk – his presence was almost certainly something to do with the large number of Swallows that were nesting there. No evidence of any kills he might have made were found.

The old quote from a poem by Alfred Lord Tennyson that "Nature is red in tooth and claw" is epitomised by this majestic killer.



Beef in Ale with Chestnuts and Cranberries

A great dish for a special meal with Christmas themes! It's that time of the year when we are planning our menus for the festive period and this is just perfect. No last minute work, except add a green veg and some mash - to soak up all the yummy gravy and very easy. Chestnuts are so delicious and we do not make use of them nearly enough

<u>Ingredients (serves upto 6)</u>

2 lb chuck steak, cubed medium small

Rapeseed oil - olive will do

2 large shallots or medium onions, peeled and sliced

1 tablespoon plain flour

½ pint beef stock - I used a stock pot - they are great

½ pint pale ale

Sea salt and freshly ground pepper

A very large handful of dried cranberries

½ teaspoon nutmeg

grated rind [use half] and juice of a medium orange

Pkt of [yummy] Merchant Gourmet Chestnuts - any supermarket

about 15 - 18 Chantenay carrots, whole

handful of chopped parsley

Beef in Ale with Chestnuts and Cranberries

Brown the beef in a hot pan with the oil. This is essential - it seals in the flavours. You will need to do this in 3 or 4 batches. Yes, I know it makes a mess of the top of the stove but it is worth it! Transfer the meat to a casserole dish. Add a little more oil in necessary and fry off the shallots and when just softening add the flour and keep stirring to cover them, then add the stock and ale, followed by the nutmeg and cranberries and orange zest and juice. Bring to a boil. Season generously and pour over the beef. Tip in the chestnuts and parsley, stir well and cover the dish [I used foil]. Put in a hotish oven 190 deg C

Wash, top and tail the carrots - I never bother to peel them and par boil for five or ten mins.

Tip them into the beef mix after about 45 mins of the cooking time. Re cover then back in the oven for a total cooking time of 1¾ hours, turning the oven down to 170 after about and hour and a half. I prepped and half cooked the casserole then chilled overnight to continue on a timer the next day. I have not done it, but cannot see why it cannot be frozen halfway and de frosted in a fridge, then add an extra 15 mins to the remaining time. It is so delicious and will happily keep in the fridge for a day or so. Enjoy!



Household Support Fund

Low-income households in Cornwall will once again receive payments to help with the ongoing cost of living crisis after Cornwall Council secured £4.5m from the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) through the Household Support Fund (HSF).

Payments of £80 per person will be made automatically to those eligible, including pensioners receiving council tax support and vulnerable adults on a low income.

In a change to the way HSF funds are allocated, this latest round will see an £80 payment made to an additional 3,000 pensioners in receipt of council tax support – previously only those in receipt of pension credit received payments. A payment of £80 per child will also be made to low-income households who claim council tax support.

In addition, Cornwall Council will continue to work with providers including Citizens Advice Cornwall, Age UK, Cornwall Rural Community Charity, Cornwall Community Foundation and Disability Cornwall to ensure other financially vulnerable residents are assisted where appropriate. The latest round of funding will run to March 31, 2025, and will provide urgent support for those most in need as living costs continue to rise. It will primarily be used to assist low-income households to cover the cost of household essentials such as energy bills, water bills and food. *Contact Information link in title*.

Saltash Tunnel Technology upgrade

November 2024 update

We're undertaking a major modernisation upgrade of the A38 Saltash Tunnel in Cornwall. This represents a £25 million investment from National Highways to improve journeys and maintain the safe operation of the tunnel for many years to come.

We are now fine-tuning the programme of works for the scheme. As with any complex scheme, dates are subject to change while commercial and programming decisions are finalised.

Current proposed key dates are:

- Early 2025 to late 2025 The tunnel will be closed in both directions on weeknights with traffic using local diversion routes.
- Summer 2025 for 5 months 'The Switch-off'. The tunnel and bridge will no longer operate on a tidal flow basis. Fixed lanes will be in operation with clear directions for each lane, until work is complete.

Cornwall Fire and Rescue recruiting.

Cornwall Fire and Rescue Service is recruiting on-call firefighters at 26 stations across the Duchy.

Cornwall's on-call firefighters come from all walks of life. They include homemakers, shopkeepers, builders, farmers, office workers and directors of companies, as well as people who are not in work.

When the call comes, they drop everything and are trained to deal with a range of emergencies such as rescues floods, crashes and chemical spills. Applicants must be 18 or above and will need to apply for a station that is five minutes from where they live or work. There is no upper age limit. Pay for on-call firefighters varies depending on the individual's availability and the station's activity rate. They receive additional pay for training nights and courses.

Applications are open for the following stations: Liskeard, Looe, Saltash, Torpoint. You can find out more about the role and the application process on the <u>Cornwall Fire and Rescue Service website</u>.
